H/ Brief Description of visitor groups from Project GROW	- Peliti (Greece) (http://www.peliti.gr/): Peliti started its activities in 1995, from that time Peliti managed to implement actions with little funding. He organized expeditions, speeches, events, visits to schools, vegetable gardens, etc realtred with seeds. All started as an idea and through placing solidarity and love were able to be implemented. This is the recipe to succeed to continue to live with dignity. - Red Andaluza de Semillas (Spain) (www.redandaluzadesemillas.org): This organization contend the loss of Andalusian agricultural biodiversity and of traditional peasant know-how. Its mains objectives are to make society aware of the need to conserve agricultural biodiversity (promotion and recuperation of popular tradition), and to maintain local cultivation varieties in situ helping farmers to recover the agricultural biodiversity of Andalusia, and facilitating the access, cultivation and exchange of seeds among farmers.		
I/ Short description of organizing groups	Réseau Semences Paysannes (RSP) (www.semencespaysannes.org) is an organization that brings together around 80 organizations (farmers' unions, artisinal seed multipliers, groups of organic and biodynamic farmers, garderners' associations, environmental organisations, citizens and international solidarity organisations, national parks, etc.). They promote and defend cultivated biodiversity and the related fields of knowledge. In addition to the coordination and consolidation of local initiatives, the RSP works to promote collective management practices and protection of farmers 'seeds, as well as scientific and legal recognition of farmers' practices of production and seed exchange and plants. Adear Rhône-Alpes (http://www.agriculturepaysanne.org/rhone-alpes). Regional association for rural development, ARDEAR Rhône-Alpes aims to help initiatives that have repercussion on rural and agricultural employment. It carries out sensibilisation actions, training activites, help in projects, expermentation and research for peasant agriculture. Among its action, it works on cultivated biodiversity of cereals, maize and animals.
